On Thursday, January 14th I attended an organizational meeting for the Committee for the Families of Iraqi War Veterans ("Sullivan County Airport Festival Committee for Veterans of Iraq War") held at the Sullivan County Airport in White Lake. This is a 501 C (3) not for profit organization committed to raising funds for **Mid HudsonValley** families of soldiers killed or wounded while fighting in Iraq and Afghanistan. This group began fundraising in 2007 and this past summer they held their first radiothon at the county airport and raised over \$ 60,000.00. This year they will be holding a radiothon sometime during the weekend of Friday August 27th and Sunday the 29th at the Villa Roma Resort & Hotel. 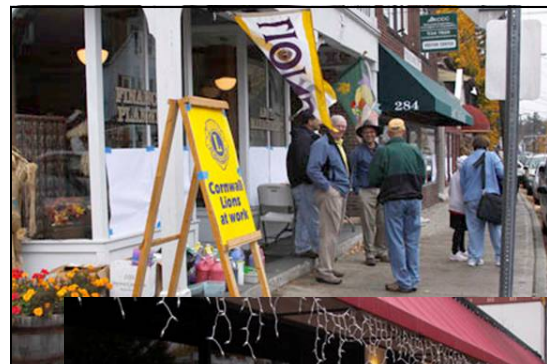

There's a New Lion In District 20-0

Yes, a new Lion whose sleeves are rolled up and is working with the Lions of New York State and Bermuda to serve their communities in a special way. His name is "Spike" and he's the mascot of the new Lions SEE program launched this year to develop a uniform and comprehensive vision-screening program for the children of our Multiple District.

Lions SEE, Screening Eyes Early, is part of a nationwide effort by Lions to help identify children with vision problems that can lead to amblyopia ("lazy eye"). Treatment for this condition is most effective when discovered early, but until recently, it was difficult to test for in pre-school children. A specialized camera and unique auto refractor now make it possible.

District and Clubs, who are already screening children, know that the screening is not the end of the process but only the beginning. Screening serves little purpose unless a child who does not pass is seen by an eye care professional for diagnosis and treatment. Several elements of the Lions SEE Program make it noteworthy and should be of interest to Lions throughout our Multiple:

- ◆ Affiliation with the Ira G. Ross Eye Institute in Buffalo New York. Dr. James Reynolds, head of the Ophthalmology Department At Buffalo University, is CEO of The Institute and is Medical Director of Lions SEE. The Institute provides professional support, interpretation of all results from both the cameras and auto refractors used to screen, office space, state wide telephone and internet access (email), photocopy and general office support at no cost.
- ◆ Follow-up, statewide! The parents of every child screened who does not pass the screening process, will be contacted. An aggressive follow-up procedure assures these children are seen by Eye Care professionals. A network of professionals is already in place and growing in MD-20. Lacking insurance or the ability to pay will not prevent a child from receiving care.
- ◆ Equipment maintenance and supplies, training and support for District and Club screening programs and centralized recordkeeping for purposes of securing future funding and research.
- ◆ Public Relations and advertising support.

This project is made possible by a grant from LCIF and contributions from participating Districts. Lions SEE is modeled after successful Lions Vision Screening programs in Colorado, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Missouri, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Rhode Island, Tennessee and Wyoming. Although it's a bit too soon to report Lions SEE statistics, Lions volunteers in the United States have screened 775,000 children since the program's inception in 1999. The overall referral rate is 6%. Complete eye care professional follow-up for referred children (50 percent as a whole) demonstrates that 65 percent (11,203) of the children referred, truly had a factor that could cause amblyopia. These results demonstrate the true success and value of the program. What better project could your Club have in its community!

The formula is simple and tested, and Lions SEE will help your Club or District put a program in place in your community. Update on Lions Haiti Relief

Received Thursday, 1/24/2010:

IPIP Al Brandel is in the Dominican Republic with Lions from the Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico. He will be meeting with Lions and Leos to hear their area's needs directly from them. Tomorrow he is headed to Port-Au-Prince to visit the tent city set up by the Haitian Lions. While there he will help distribute supplies.
